"Albanian Case Law on the Recognition
of Personal Status Acquired Abroad"
(public order v. right to private and family life)

What happens in cases where fundamental human rights to personal and family life collide with rules of Private International Law? In this short lecture our lecturer will talk about case law of the Albanian High Court concerning the non-recognition of foreign judgements on adoption of an adult and explain the reasons for this; she will also delve into the Albanian administrative practice which requires a change of a personal name acquired abroad if such name is composed of two or more components in order to be registered into the Civil Status Register. Our lecturer shall discuss possible solutions which a private international law and/or human rights protection approach can offer to avoid harsh results. Dr. Qarri 's main fields of interest are the law of obligations and family law including European family law.
